#### Purpose

Understand the current U.S. federal government focus on protecting intellectual property through research security requirements for academia

"Some foreign governments, including those of the People's Republic of China, Russia, and Iran, are working vigorously...to acquire, through both licit and illicit means, U.S. research and technology. There have been efforts to induce American scientists to secretively conduct research programs on behalf of foreign governments or to inappropriately disclose non-public results from research funded by U.S. government sources. This is unacceptable."

## White House focus on research security

#### Trump Administration

- 2019: OSTP-led initiative to coordinate federal research policies
- 2021: National Security Presidential Memorandum 33 (NSPM-33)
   Biden Administration
- 2022: <u>Guidance for implementing NSPM-33</u>
  - Federal sponsoring agencies to develop model grant application forms, and
  - Clear and effective rules for ensuring research security and researcher responsibilities

## NSPM-33: Standardization of Disclosure Requirements

- Common disclosure forms have been developed for:
  - Biographical Sketch, and
  - Current and Pending (Other) Support
  - The Common Disclosure forms were published on 11/1/23.
- The forms include individual certifications for disclosure accuracy and completeness.
- Also includes updated <u>Definitions</u> (Nov 2023)
- NSF will implement these forms with the PAPPG 24-1

## NSPM-33: Standardization of Disclosure Requirements

<u>CURRENT AND PENDING (OTHER) SUPPORT COMMON FORM</u> November 1, 2023

"Consistent with NSPM-33, individuals are required to disclose contracts associated with participation in programs sponsored by foreign governments, instrumentalities, or entities, including foreign government-sponsored talent recruitment programs. Further, if individuals receive direct or indirect support that is funded by a foreign government-sponsored talent recruitment program, even where the support is provided through an intermediary and does not require membership in the foreign government-sponsored talent recruitment program, that support must be disclosed. Individuals must also report other foreign government sponsored or affiliated activities. In accordance with 42 USC § 19232, individuals are prohibited from being a party in a malign foreign talent recruitment program."

A <u>table</u> entitled, NSPM-33 Implementation Guidance Pre- and Post-award Disclosures Relating to the Biographical Sketch and Current and Pending (Other) Support1 has been created to provide helpful reference information regarding pre-award and post-award disclosures. The table includes the types of activities to be reported, where such activities must be reported in the application, as well as when updates are required in the application and award lifecycle. A final column identifies activities that are not required to be reported.

## NSPM-33: Consequences for Violation of Disclosure Requirements


Serious potential consequences for the University:

- Rejection of an R&D application
- Preserving an award, but requiring removal of certain individuals
- Suspension or termination of an R&D award
- Suspension or denial of Title IV funds by the Department of Education (resulting in denial of federal student aid)
- Alert other federal agencies of the non-compliance


### NSPM-33: Research Security Program

Certification from the university that a research security program has been implemented with five elements:

- Cybersecurity
- Foreign travel security
- Research security training
- Export control training, as appropriate
- Appoint a Research Security point of contact (POC)



# Extramural Disclosure Training (EDT)



- EDT is required for PIs, investigators and other senior/key personnel on UH extramural requests for funding (grant applications) submitted through myGRANT


#### Conflicts of Interest (COI)

### Who needs to submit a COI disclosure?

Investigators and senior/key personnel named on extramural proposals and awards must submit their COI disclosure form through the rCOI system.

NOTE: myGRANT access is not required to complete the rCOI form




### Important Note

When reporting your involvement with external (non-UH) entities, you MUST disclose your relationships with both domestic and FOREIGN organizations, governments and individuals.



When in doubt, report!



#### Sponsor-Specific Disclosures

Always follow specific instructions for disclosures required by extramural sponsors.


- Biographical Sketch
  - List all positions, affiliations, and appointments
    - Including both foreign and domestic
- Current and Pending Support
  - Also known as "Other Support," include ALL sources of support for your research, including
    - Including both foreign and domestic

#### **NSF Update - PAPPG 24-1**

NSF will release the latest Proposal & Award Policies & Procedures Guide (<u>PAPPG 24-1</u>) for proposals submitted or due on or after May 20, 2024.

#### Relevant changes:

- Malign Foreign Talent Recruitment Programs
- Common Forms for the Biographical Sketch and Current and Pending (Other Support)



#### Malign Foreign Talent Recruitment Program (MFTRP)

Any program, position, or activity that includes compensation\* by a foreign country at any level that involves one or more of the following:

- Unauthorized transfer of IP, materials, data products, or other nonpublic information;
- Recruitment of trainees or researchers to enroll in the program;
- Establishing a lab or company, or accepting a faculty position or other appointment, in the foreign country;
- Being unable to terminate the foreign talent recruitment program;
- Being limited in the capacity to carry out a research and development award, or requires engagement in work that overlaps or duplicates a federal award;
- Being required to apply for funding from the sponsoring foreign government;
- Being required to omit acknowledgement of the recipient institution (UH) or the federal agency sponsoring the research;
- Being required not to disclose participation in the program to the federal research agency or employing institution (UH); or
- Having a conflict of interest or commitment contrary to a federal award.

#### AND Sponsored by one of the following:

- A foreign country of concern as defined by the Secretary of State, and currently includes China, North Korea, Russia, and Iran;
- An entity based in a foreign country of concern; or
- An academic institution or foreign talent recruitment program on the lists developed under paragraphs (8) and (9) of Section 1286(c) of the John S. McCain National Defense Authorization Act for Fiscal Year 2019

### \*Compensation

Compensation broadly includes cash, in-kind compensation, research funding, promised future compensation, complimentary foreign travel, things of non de minimis value, honorific titles, career advancement, or other types of remuneration or consideration.



### NSF Certification Required



- MFTRP definition PAPPG Introduction, Section D
- Any individual who is a current party to a MFTRP is ineligible to serve a a senior/key person on an NSF proposal/award
- Each senior/key person must certify prior to the proposal submission that they are NOT a party to a MFTRP (through Biographical Sketch and Current and Pending Support)
- Certification annually thereafter
- Organizations must certify upon proposal submission that all senior/key personnel have been made aware of and complied with the requirement that they are not a party to a MFTRP.

### NSF Common Forms -Biographical Sketch

- Required for all senior/key personnel
- Individuals are required to disclose contracts associated with participation in programs sponsored by foreign governments, instrumentalities, or entities, including foreign governmentsponsored talent recruitment programs
- Must certify that they are not a party to a Malign Foreign Talent Recruitment Program (MFTRP)
- Must be created in SciENcv
- Page limitation has been removed

#### BIOGRAPHICAL SKETCH COMMON FORM November 1, 2023

This Biographical Sketch Common Form provides instructions for submission of a biographical sketch by each individual identified as a <u>senior/key person</u> on a Federally funded research project. The biographical sketch is used to assess how well qualified the individual, team, or organization is to conduct the proposed activities.

Consistent with NSPM-33, individuals are required to disclose contracts associated with participation in programs sponsored by foreign governments, instrumentalities, or entities, including foreign government-sponsored talent recruitment programs. Further, if individuals receive direct or indirect support that is funded by a foreign government-sponsored talent recruitment program, even where the support is provided through an intermediary and does not require membership in the foreign government-sponsored talent recruitment program, that support must be disclosed. Individuals must also report other foreign government sponsored or affiliated activities. In accordance with 42 USC § 19232, individuals are prohibited from being a party in a malign foreign talent recruitment program.

A table entitled, <u>NSPM-33 Implementation Guidance Pre- and Post-award Disclosures Relating to the Biographical Sketch and Current and Pending (Other) Support has been created to provide helpful reference information regarding pre-award and post-award disclosures. The table includes the types of activities to be reported, where such activities must be reported in the application, as well as when updates are required in the application and award lifecycle. A final column identifies activities that are not required to be reported.</u>

Individuals are reminded not to submit any personal information in the biographical sketch. This includes items such as: home address; home telephone, fax, or cell phone numbers; home e-mail address; driver's license number; marital status; personal hobbies; and the like. Such personal information is not appropriate for the biographical sketch and is not relevant to the merits of the proposal. The Federal research funding agency is not responsible or in any way liable for the release of such material.

The format of the Biographical Sketch Common Form is provided below. There is no page or character limit to this section of the application.

#### \* = required

#### \*Identifying Information

\*Name: Enter the name of the senior/key person (Last Name, First Name, and Middle Name, including any applicable suffix).

Persistent Identifier (PID) of the Senior/Key Person: Enter the PID of the senior/key person. The PID is a unique, open digital identifier that distinguishes the individual from every other researcher with the same or a similar name.

\*Position Title: Enter the current position title of the senior/key person



## NSF Common Forms Current and Pending (Other) Support

#### CURRENT AND PENDING (OTHER) SUPPORT COMMON FORM

The individual agrees to update this disclosure at the request of the Federal research funding agency prior to the award of support and at any subsequent time the agency determines appropriate during the term of the award. (Refer to the Federal research funding agency's policy on updating award support).

#### Instructions for Submission of the Current and Pending (Other) Support Common Form

Current and pending (other) support information is used to assess the capacity or any conflicts of commitment that may impact the ability of the individual to carry out the research effort as proposed. The information also helps assess any potential scientific and budgetary overlap/duplication with the project being proposed.

This document provides instructions on submission of current and pending (other) support information for each individual identified as a <a href="mailto:seniorizeta:seniorize

A separate submission must be provided for each proposal and active project, as well as in-kind contributions using the instructions and format specified below. Note that there is no page limitation for this section of the application, though some fields have character limitations for consistency and equity.

Consulting activities must be disclosed under the proposals and active projects section of the form when any of the following scenarios apply:

- The consulting activity will require the senior/key person to perform research as part of the consulting activity;
- The consulting activity does not involve performing research, but is related to the senior/key person's research portfolio and may have the ability to impact funding, alter time or effort commitments, or otherwise impact scientific integrity; or
- The consulting entity has provided a contract that requires the senior/key person to conceal or withhold confidential financial or other ties between the senior/key person and the entity, irrespective of the duration of the engagement.

Consistent with NSPM-33, individuals are required to disclose contracts associated with participation in programs sponsored by foreign governments, instrumentalities, or entities, including foreign government-sponsored talent recruitment programs. Further, if individuals receive direct or indirect support that is funded by a foreign government-sponsored talent recruitment program, even where the support is provided through an intermediary and does not require membership in the foreign government-sponsored talent recruitment program, that support must be disclosed. Individuals must also report other foreign government sponsored or affiliated activities. In accordance with 42 USC § 19232, individuals are prohibited from being a party in a malign foreign talent recruitment program.

- Required for all senior/key personnel
- Used to assess the capacity or any conflicts of commitment that may impact the ability of the individual to carry out the research effort as proposed
- Information helps assess any potential scientific and budgetary overlap/duplication with the project being proposed
- Must certify that they are not a party to a Malign Foreign Talent Recruitment Program (MFTRP)
- Must be created in SciENcv

### Consequences for Non-Disclosure

- Submission of proposals through UH myGRANT requires the PI and senior/key personnel to certify that the information within the proposal is true, complete, and accurate.
- The PI must further certify in myGRANT that Conflict of Interest requirements have been addressed.
- When applying for federal funding, misrepresentations and/or omissions may be subject to individual prosecution and liability pursuant to, but not limited to, False Claims Act under 18 U.S.C. §§ 287, 1001, 1031 and 31 U.S.C. §§ 3729-3733.
